Vincent Hanley Summer School: The Music Legacy of Vincent Hanley with **Conor McAnally and Guest Speakers**

A highlight of this year's programme is the Vincent Hanley Summer School, a symposium and vital opportunity to celebrate one of Ireland's significant celebrities and cultural figures, Vincent Hanley, a Clonmel native.

TV writer, producer and director Conor McAnally will be joined by Billy McGrath (Filmmaker and Irish TV veteran) and Jim Carroll (music journalist and editor RTÉ Brainstorm) to discuss Vincent's life as a pioneer of Irish broadcasting, trailblazer and household favourite, with an encyclopaedic knowledge of music and popular culture that took him past radio to TV and beyond.

Since his death in 1987 and despite his iconic status, Vincent has not been given the critical attention he deserves beyond a couple of TV and film documentaries. The Vincent Hanley Summer School seeks to right this imbalance, exploring Vincent's legacy while also endeavouring to make sense of the extraordinary change in Irish society in the intervening years.

As a young gay man, Vincent was emblematic of a newly emboldened generation of LGBTQ+ people that left an indelible mark on a society grappling with change and modernity. Ireland's first celebrity AIDS death, Vincent Hanley deserves to be defined by more than just the manner of his passing, as culturally significant as it was. 



The Fionn MacCumhaill players present a new short film telling the life story of Bridget Cleary who died violently in 1895 in Ballyvadlea near Cloneen, Tipperary at the hands of her husband Michael. Bridget, a young seamstress from Ballyvadlea in the parish of Drangan/Cloneen, became ill in March 1895 and her husband, believing her to be a changeling, convinced the family, including her father, that she had been taken by the fairies.

Using herbs and potions from a local herbalist Bridget was forced to drink the concoctions and was tortured by using a red-hot poker by her husband as he tried to rid her from the spell and bring his wife back. Michael eventually cracked on 15th March and burned her to death in a fit of rage. This film aims to bring some vindication for Bridget who was treated badly in life – and indeed in death. No marker was ever put on her grave – she was buried late at night by four RIC officers with no mourners.

Michael Cleary was convicted of manslaughter and her family all served time in prison.



After a decade and a half in duo The Lost Brothers Irish musician Oisín Leech announced himself in 2024 as a singer-songwriter of some distinction with his stunning solo debut album 'Cold Sea'. Ireland's longest running quartet will entertain our audience with a dazzling selection of works from Mozart, Beethoven and a world premiere of Marian Ingoldsby's String Quartet No.2.

Mozart's D minor quartet K.421 is the second in the set of six quartets that Mozart dedicated to Haydn, famously describing them as his children and as 'the fruit of long and laborious efforts'. It is the only one of the set in a minor key and the prevailing mood of intense darkness sets in memorable relief those precious moments where the music moves into a major key and the clouds lift.

Marian Ingoldsby's world premiere of her String Quartet No.2 written in memory of artist Eimear King, whose work will be projected during the performance.

Beethoven wrote his set of three Rasoumovsky Quartets in 1806, commissioned by the Russian Ambassador in Vienna, Count Andrey Rasoumovsky. The famously edgy and brittle first movement gives way to one of Beethoven's most gorgeous creations, the slow second movement which he marked 'to be played with deep feeling'. The intricate Scherzo is followed by a wild and spectacularly virtuosic finale..




